During our visit to the HKMM, participants will be divided into two groups based on language (Mandarin & English). One group will start with a tour of the permanent exhibition, while the other group will focus on viewing and discussing a seventeenth-century Coromandel screen. The groups will then switch activities. The visit to the HKMM will conclude with a 15-minute discussion. The tour will be led and facilitated by Jeremy Michell (Deputy Director) and Sammie Wu (Assistant Curator) of the museum.

At the HKUST Library, participants will be introduced to the university's unique map collection. 26 historical maps have been selected for display, including a seventeenth/eighteenth-century facsimile of Matteo Ricci's world map produced in Japan and a colored map of the coast of Fujian and Taiwan island. Participants will explore shared interests and similarities between Coromandel lacquer screens and monumental maps mounted on screens.

The visit and tour will be facilitated by Shirley Zhang, and Joyce Yau from the HKUST Library. Dr. Marco Caboara from the HKUST Divisions of Humanities will provide a special introduction to the HKUST map collection. Dr. Qiuzi Guo (Digital Humanities & Art History) will join the tour as a special guest.

At the CUHK Art Museum, a special lacquer conservation workshop will be conducted by Ms. Chunrong Hua, Associate Curator at the Department of Conservation, The Palace Museum, Beijing. Ms. Hua is a 2024/25 J.S. Lee Memorial Fellow currently visiting the CUHK Art Museum to carry out the conservation work on a Kangxi Coromandel screen from the museum's collection. She will impart her valuable knowledge and expertise on the conservation of the Coromandel screen: https://www.artmuseum.cuhk.edu.hk/zh/collections/results/detail/3058

The Metal specialist Miss Yin Hang 尹航, Associate Curator at the Department of Conservation, The Palace Museum, Beijing, and the curators of the CUHK Art Museum will join the event as special guests.

The workshop will be interpreted by Heidi Wong, Manager of Education at CUHK Art Museum.

Under the guidance of Dr. Bai Fang 白芳, Director of Exhibition at the Guangdong Provincial Museum, participants will have the unique opportunity to explore a Kangxi-period Coromandel screen in the museum's storage: https://www.gdmuseum.com/cn/col49/148599

During the visit, one group will begin with a tour of the permanent lacquer exhibition, with a particular emphasis on nineteenth-century lacquerware. Simultaneously, the other group will concentrate on viewing a seventeenth-century Coromandel screen in the museum's storage. The groups will later switch activities to ensure a comprehensive experience.

Further, a demonstration of the modern technique of Coromandel lacquer will be provided by Mr. Cheng Zhi, a Guangzhou-based lacquer conservator.

Under the guidance of Mrs. Linlin Zeng and Mrs. Xiaoqiu Zhu, Associate Heads of the Guangzhou Museum, selected lacquer and textile objects will be showcased in the museum's study room. Participants will have the chance to closely examine these objects, which share material, pictorial, or compositional similarities with the Coromandel lacquers.

The museum is located inside a historical site. Participants will also have the opportunity to get to know the museum's architecture, which dates back to its construction in 1380.

1.30-2.30 pm Light lunch (sandwiches, coffee, and beverages)

2.30-4.30 pm Chen Clan Ancestral Hall 陳家祠博物館 (built 1888, now Guangdong Folk Arts Museum)

Under the guidance of Dr. Haiyan Huang (museum director) and Mr. Shun Hu (custodian of the museum), the museum will open its storage and display a variety of lacquers made of various techniques and textile imitations of birthday celebration screens. Due to the space limit in the storage area, participants will be divided into two groups. One group will have the opportunity to look at the museum's significant architectural heritage and permanent lacquer objects, while the other group will commence viewing the storage. The groups will subsequently switch activities.

The architectural complex of the Chen Clan Ancestral Hall offers a glimpse into how a private estate might have looked in pre-modern

China. These settings are often featured on Coromandel screens as the architectural backdrop for themes such as the birthday celebration theme of General Guo Ziyi or scholarly gatherings.
